It is vanity to seek and trust in riches that perish. It is of no worth to cherish the honor of men and to be puffed up with pride. It is useless to follow the lusts of the body and desire things for which severe punishment will later come. It is a waste of time to wish for long life and to care little about a well-spent life. It serves no purpose to be concerned only with the present and not to make provision for things to come. It is vanity to love what passes quickly away and not to look ahead to the place where eternal joy abides.

Often recall the proverb: "*The eye is not satisfied with seeing nor the ear filled with hearing.*" Try, even more, to turn your heart from the love of visible things and have an eternal perspective. For they who follow their own evil passions stain their consciences and lose the grace of God.
